As part of Leicestershire Constabulary's commitment to build and strengthen neighbourhood policing, we have introduced a Policing Pledge, which outlines the standards of service that you should expect to receive from us. It also gives you a stronger voice in setting local police priorities for the area where you live.

Together with Leicestershire Police Authority, we are already committed to providing a second to none policing service to you - the public of Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland, but by adopting the Policing Pledge, we promise that we will deliver an even better service – one that is accessible, responsive and makes you feel confident about our concern and professionalism.

In your neighbourhood we will:

- Provide you with details of your local neighbourhood policing teams
- Ensure neighbourhood policing teams and other police patrols are visible on your patch at the times when they will be most effective
- Respond within 24 hours to messages left for your neighbourhood policing team
- Aim to be with you promptly (if attendance is required) if you call us about an issue which has been agreed as a neighbourhood priority
- Hold monthly public meetings or surgeries, giving you an opportunity to meet your local policing team, tell them about issues that concern you and have your say
- Make more information available about local crime and policing issues, including the provision of crime maps

Neighbourhood update

Listed below are the priorities you told us about six months ago and how we tackled them:

You told us... To combat anti-social behaviour along High Street particularly around the Tesco Express area and surrounding alleyways where young people congregate.
We responded... We have increased high visibility patrols within the area; More staff were allocated to assist us, The County Council anti-social behaviour workers also spent time at the location with the young people. Groups of youths were moved away where necessary and some dealt with using the anti-social behaviour enforcement process.
You told us... To work with partner agencies to develop facilities for young people within Measham, such as youth shelters.
We responded... We are pleased to say a drop in facility has now opened at Measham Youth Club on Friday evenings.
